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1. Covid-19 Guidance

1.1 Guidance update on parental visits

We wrote to childcare providers on 18 November to thank them for their hard work this year, and to highlight some important messages as we head into the winter period – recognising that unfortunately the pandemic is not yet over. The letter signposted providers to some sections of the guidance which may be helpful as they think about planning for winter and the festive season – to keep children, staff and their families as safe as possible. It also highlighted the importance of us all sticking to the baseline mitigations that are in place, and taking steps such as getting vaccinated, having a booster jag if you are eligible, and testing regularly. 1.3 Warn and Inform letters

The Warn and Inform letters that settings send to parents/carers when they are informed of a positive COVID-19 case among their staff or children have been translated into the following languages: Gaelic, Chinese (Simplified), Urdu, Punjabi, Polish, Arabic. 2. Workforce and Professional Learning

2.1 Bringing qualified and experienced practitioners back in to the sector

As reported in the October update, along with our colleagues at the Scottish Social Services Council (SSSC) we have been considering ways to bring qualified and experienced practitioners in to the sector. With that in mind we have recently invited those whose registrations with SSSC have lapsed in the last five years, to re-join the sector.

Over 150 people, from across the country, have registered details of their experience and qualifications on MySSSC. Settings are already accessing information on potential candidates in their area and getting in touch with them about available roles. This information can be found by logging into MySSSC.

This is not a job matching service, but a means for individuals to express an interest in re-joining the sector and for employers to access a pool of experienced candidates, potentially cutting down on the time and cost commitments of recruitment. Employers will still be required to undertake the necessary pre-employment checks such as PVG applications and references.

This is a free service, available for all childcare settings and we are keen to make sure we understand whether it proves valuable to childcare employers. We would ask, that settings keep SSSC informed should they recruit individuals via the service. If settings use this service and select the candidates they are interested in, SSSC colleagues will send reminders to provide an update on the outcome.

4. Outdoor Play and Learning

4.1 Outdoor Play and Learning at the Learning Places Scotland Conference

This year's <u>Learning Places Scotland Conference</u> at the SEC in Glasgow on 23 and 24 November, featured a stand-alone ELC stage which showcased a range of inspiring and though-provoking presentations. The conference is the annual gathering of the education community in partnership with the Scottish Government with a focus on the funding, design, build, maintenance and management of early years, schools, colleges and universities. It explored the evidence, benefits and spatial possibilities of connecting people, places and learning.

Kate Smith, from the Scottish Government's Childcare: Provision, Practice and Communications Unit, chaired a session 'Out to Play - recognising the value of outdoor spaces as a learning environment' at the Learning Places Scotland Conference, Glasgow, on Tuesday 23 November. Speakers Lynn Taylor, Education Scotland, Mairi Ferris, Inspiring Scotland, and Zoe Sills, Earthtime, shared examples of adapting and evolving outdoor spaces and developing practice. The session includes video footage of children and practitioners in action, including one showing how one nursery magically transformed an unused outdoor space, at low cost.

Dr. Claire Warden, International Education Consultant, will also speak about the success of Scotland's Virtual Nature School as part of a Digital themed ELC session on Wednesday 24 November.

5. The Promise Partnership

The Promise Partnership – A Good Childhood is an investment of circa £3.25 million from the Scottish Government. It is intended to deliver change in line with Scotland's commitment to #KeepThePromise and ensure children and young people grow up loved, safe and respected. The importance of maintaining loving, safe relationships is one of five priority areas of the Promise Scotland's Plan 21-24 this area is detailed in Change Programme One - A Good Childhood. This funding strand aims to offer investment that will help ensure children and young people experience a good childhood in a loving family environment, recognising family will mean different things to each child or young person.

Up to £100,000 is available per proposal and is open to individual organisations or collaborations. The investment is to help build upon or put structures in place that will create the space to think, plan and start to co-design changes that ensures a Good Childhood. Your proposal needs to reflect and consider <u>what</u> has to happen within your organisation, collaboration or local area to support a Good Childhood. You should detail <u>how</u> investment will be an enabler for systemic or infrastructure changes. This could include organisational cultures, changing practices, listening and planning, embedding participatory approaches that will support future service re-design.

Deadlines for applications is 3 December, an information session will take place on 4 November and decisions for the funding will be made in January 2022. For full details go to The Promise Partnership – Corra.

6. The Scottish Milk and Healthy Snack Scheme

The new Scheme allows for all preschool children attending a registered eligible setting to receive a funded portion of milk (or specified non-dairy alternative) and, for the first time, a healthy snack each day they spend 2 hours or more in childcare.

The Scottish Government is working in partnership with COSLA, Local Authorities, Child Care Settings and other key stakeholders to monitor the roll-out of the new Scheme including via an Implementation and Operations Group that launched on 26 October 2021.

The aim of the Implementation and Operations Group is to ensure the scheme is meeting the needs of children and settings.

A key element of the Group's work is looking to increase the number of children benefiting from the scheme. This will involve identifying and addressing potential barriers to registration as we look ahead to scheme Year 2 and beyond.
